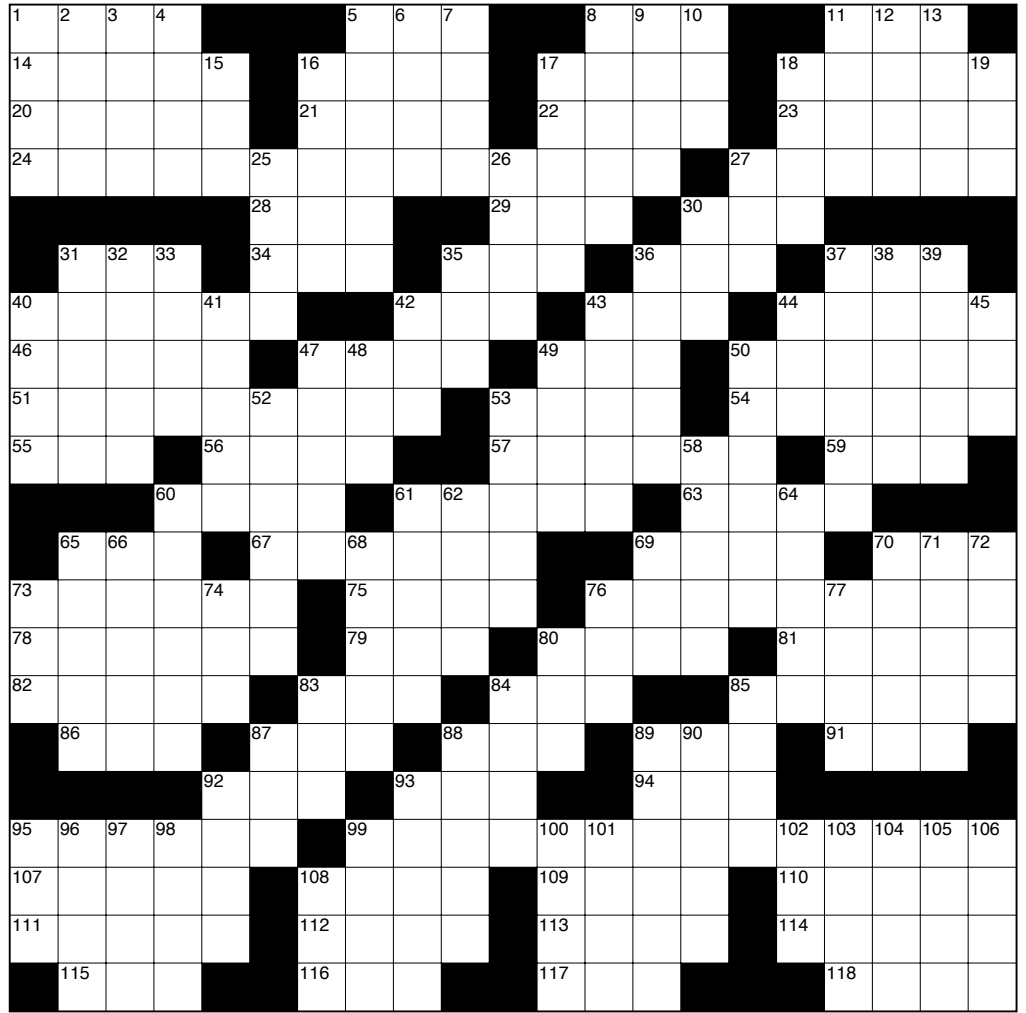


Buried Treasure *by Merl Reagle*
